Answer **one** question. Refer closely to the works of **at least two** poets you have studied.

- 1. The openings and closings of poems are elements that are significant to both poets and readers. Show how **at least two** poets you have studied have given weight and interest to either or both of these elements.
- 2. Many poems contain dramatic elements that suggest possibilities for the theatrical. Referring to the work of **at least two** poets you have studied, examine how these elements are presented and developed within the poems.
- 3. Often what others have thought or said is used by poets to add new angles or depth of meaning to their poems. From your study of **at least two** poets, examine the ways they make use of the ideas or speech of others.
- 4. Loss and/or longing can both be the subjects of poems. In the work of **at least two** poets you have studied, examine the strategies poets have used to convey these and similar feelings as well as their ways of dealing with or resolving these common human experiences.
- 5. "No man is a problem to himself, but society may become his problem." In the work of **at least two** poets you have studied, show how the poet has represented the conflict between personal convictions and beliefs and those of such institutions as family, schools or governments.
- **6.** Free verse poems often can create quite different effects compared with the regular rhythms of metrical verse. In the work of **at least two** poets, highlight some of the techniques and effects achieved when poems employ either or both of these approaches.
