Her dance style:



- When the choreography style is widely known as the 'Polyswagg'.
- According to her, 'Polyswagg' is "combining sassy woman fire with aggressive inner strength".
- Her choreography usually incorporates strong, hard-hitting moves and she claims to have gotten inspirations from "the song, the people around me, and the imagery in the room it's all about that moment".
- This dance style of hers stands out as it is empowering and her entire crew is able to make a statement through the dance moves they execute.

- Co-founded the '*Playground'* an open forum where professional dancers can directly engage with emerging and other established choreographers.

- She claims to have gotten her inspiration from "the emotion of everyday life." She adds, "I take it and enhance it when I create".

Parris Goebel: The outfit used in the performance barely stood out as it was camoflaged by its surroundings; both the outfit and the surroudings where the dance was performed at was black in color and dimly lighted. Loni Landon: Based on the video, viewers like myself were unable to observe the facial expression used; thus, this affected the identification of emotions in the dance.

Parris Goebel: The dance moves and transitions between the dancers were inconsistent and thus, making it difficult for others to follow. Loni Landon: The overall course and flow of the dance is smooth and understandable from the point of view of an audience.
