- 1. Compare and contrast the process of socialization in two different kinds of society.
- 2. Illustrate and explain how patterns of residence after marriage are linked to other aspects of social, economic and/or political organization in one society you have studied.
- **3.** What do anthropologists mean when they say that ethnicity is more than just an issue of 'common blood'? Illustrate your answer with reference to specific ethnography.
- **4.** Distinguish carefully between myth and ritual and show how both may provide an anthropological understanding of one society you have studied.
- 5. Compare and contrast two different societies with reference to forms of hierarchy and differentiation.
- 6. The shift from a subsistence to a market economy can have large, and sometimes contradictory, consequences for individuals as well as for a society as a whole. With reference to specific ethnography, identify and compare the consequences of such a shift for both individuals and larger groups.
- 7. Compare and contrast tribal and state societies with reference to the division of labour and forms of authority.
- 8. What can anthropologists contribute to the current debate about human rights?
- **9.** With reference to specific examples, compare and contrast the advantages and disadvantages of doing fieldwork in a different society with doing fieldwork 'at home'.
- **10.** Using two examples, illustrate and explain the process of cultural revitalization.
