Translate into English the section of the following passage indicated between the asterisks. A translation of the rest of the passage appears on the facing page.

1. Menon, the Thessalian, is willing to behave dishonourably if he can enjoy power and prosperity.

26 ὥσπερ δὲ τις ἀγάλλεται ἐπὶ θεοσεβείᾳ καὶ ἀληθείᾳ καὶ δικαιοσύνητι, οὕτω Μένων ἠγάλλετο τῷ ἐξαπατᾶν δύνασθαι, τῷ πλάσασθαι ψεύδη, τῷ φίλους διαγελᾶν· τὸν δὲ μὴ πανούργον τῶν ἀπαιδευτῶν ἀεὶ ἐνόμιζεν εἶναι. 20

τὸ αὐτὸ (section 22, line 7) + dative = *the same as*

Menon the Thessalian was manifestly eager for enormous wealth, eager as well to hold command (in order to get more wealth), and eager for honour (in order to increase his gains).

... And just as a man prides himself upon piety, truthfulness and justice, so Menon prided himself upon ability to deceive, the fabrication of lies, and the mocking of friends; but the man who was not a rascal he always thought of as belonging to the uneducated.
